Note: all seam allowances are 1/4" unless other wise stated

<u>Cutting Instructions</u>			6"	12"
Background	Cut	10	2" squares	3" squares
	Cut	4	1 ½" x 2 ½" rectangles	2 ½" x 4 ½"" rectangles
Fabric 1	Cut	4	2" squares	3" squares
Fabric 2	Cut	4	2" squares	3" squares
	Cut	4	1 ½" squares	2 ½" squares
Fabric 3	Cut	2	2 " squares	3" squares
	Cut	4	1 ½" squares	2 ½" squares

## **Piecing Instructions**

- 1. Drawn a diagonal line on the wrong side of the 2" (3") Background squares.
- 2. Pair together each Fabric 1, Fabric 2 and Fabric 3 2" (3") squares with a Background 2" (3") square. With right sides together, sew a ¼" seam on either side of the drawn line.


Cut apart on the drawn line and press. You will now have two half square triangles.

Repeat and you will need Fabric 1 8 half square triangles Fabric 2 8 half square triangles Fabric 3 4 half square triangles


Trim each one to  $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " (2  $\frac{1}{2}$ ") square. **IMPORTANT**: take care to trim your half square triangles so you don't loose the points.

3. Layout your half square triangles and remaining pieces as per the layout below.

The block is pieced in quarters as shown – make four matching quarters. Then rotate each quarter and join together, taking care to butt your seams.



Make four units



Well done, another gorgeous block make. Press well and your block will measure 6 ½" (12 ½")
