Cutting Instruction	<u>S</u>		6"	12"
Background	Cut	8	1½" squares	2 ½" squares
Fabric A	Cut	2	1 ½" x 3 ½" rectangles	2 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles
	Cut	1	1 ½" square	2 ½" square
Fabric B	Cut	2	1 ½" x 3 ½" rectangles	2 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles
	Cut	1	1 ½" square	2 ½" square
Fabric C	Cut	2	$1 \frac{1}{2}$ x $3 \frac{1}{2}$ rectangles	$2\frac{1}{2}$ x $6\frac{1}{2}$ rectangles
	Cut	1	1 $\frac{1}{2}$ square	2 $\frac{1}{2}$ square
Fabric D	Cut	2	1 ½" x 3 ½" rectangles	2 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles
	Cut	1	1 ½" square	2 ½" square

## **Piecing Instructions**

This week's block is a nice quick one to make – not a half square triangle in sight.


1. Sew a **Background** 1 ½" (2 ½") square to either side of a **Fabric A** 1 ½" (2 ½") square.

Press the seams to the dark fabric.

2. Sew a **Fabric A** 1 ½" x 3 ½" (2 ½" x 6 ½") rectangle to the top and bottom of this unit.

Press the seams to the dark fabric.


Measure and check that this unit measures  $3 \frac{1}{2}$ " x  $3 \frac{1}{2}$ " ( $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6 \frac{1}{2}$ "). Give it a wee hair cut if necessary.



3. Now, you repeat those same steps and make a unit from the **Fabric B**, **Fabric C**, **& Fabric D** fabrics.

Time to put your block together. Piece two units together. Repeat with the remaining two blocks. Now sew the two rows together, taking care to butt the middle seam.

Press well and check that your block measures 6 ½" x 6 ½" (12 ½" x 12 ½").



Well done, another stunning block made.

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
